
### 1878

The Robbins and Myers Co. begins as a gray iron foundry in Springfield, Ohio. The primary business involved high-quality castings for agricultural tools and machines, then broadened into bicycle parts when the industry booms at the end of the century.



### 1925

Influenced by Henry Ford's development of mass production techniques, R&M begins expansion into other industries where their motors can be used.



#### 1970


Robbins & Myers reorganizes its operations into four autonomous, product-oriented divisions: electric motors, material handling devices, fans, and pumps.



The Hoist and Crane division of Robbins & Myers is purchased, and the new company, R&M Materials Handling, Inc., is born.



R&M begins development and production of electric motors used in fans and household appliances (like sewing machines, vacuums and refrigerators), eventually expanding into production of an armature for an automobile starter motor for both GM and Ford.



## 1929

Robbins & Myers begins manufacturing electric hoists, cranes and winches.



### 1980

Over the years, Robbins & Myers releases 7 different generations of wire rope hoists, serving a wide variety of industries.



### 2000

R&M enters mass restructuring of business, changing operation to gain efficiency from a global supply chain and focus on providing industry-leading customer service.



2009

R&M celebrates their 80th anniversary with a move to a new headquarter facility and introduces the QL electric chain package.



R&M increases their digital footprint with the release of a new website and distributor portal.



#### 2019

R&M celebrates 90 years of producing hoisting and material handling equipment.



# 2001

R&M launches its 8th wire rope hoist platform, the SX WRH & QX crane packages, and introduces its first chain product line.



The LK electric chain hoist and SXL open winch wire rope hoist are launched, expanding R&M's product portfolio to cover from 1/8 ton – 250 tons.



R&M's product portfolio is broadened with the release of the heavy-duty DXW winch hoist.
